This year has presented numerous challenges including an excessively wet summer, followed by a mild but extremely dry winter. Add to those factors the fast-evolving science of non-chemical pest management and bio-compounds targeting specific pests, it's easy to understand there's a lot to keep in front of against the background of an increasingly pressured economy.

As Active Pest co-owner and pre-construction specialist Tony Dunn alluded to in his acceptance speech at the 2017 NSW Business Chamber Awards on August 29, "What many people wouldn't be aware of outside the industry is that several well-known national pest control brands have been taken over by international conglomerates, taking profits off-shore. where we're from and what we offer." Jim Burgess, expert bug guru and the other half of Active Pest's ownership duo says "People don't necessarily pay attention to who they're going to call for pest control. They notice spiders dangling from the ceiling and cockroaches in the cupboards and probably go to search on Google. But, we want people to recognise our bright blue advertising and recall our radio spots with the tagline 'The Pesties

in Blue'. When they visit our website, they'll see we tick a lot of boxes in that we're local, fully licenced, insured and using only the highest quality, environmentally-responsible pest management techniques available.

"To stay ahead in the pest control field, we need to run a tight ship and keep abreast of industry developments and legislation. At the same time, administrative practices and field technologies are continually upgrading at record pace. It is imperative to our continued success that we work on our business as much as work in it, Jim asserts.
